This week in nutshell...

English/Language Arts

- Worked with our Vocabulary and the word skill of adding the inflectional ending (-ing) to words ending in VC and VCC
 - Identified the base word of each list word with an ending
 - Identified the ending of each base word
 - Played a matching game in whole groups
 - Continued to identify word parts (prefixes, suffixes)
 - Discussed the etymology (word origins) of root words...even in MATH!
 - Do you know what "ped" means in Greek? Can you think of some words with "ped" in it? We did- pedal, pedestrian, pedometer, etc.
 - Where does the abbreviation for pound (lb.) come from? Give up? In Latin the word for pound is libra (a shortened version of libra pondopound weight)
 - How about solipsism? What does it mean? Well, "solus" in Latin means alone like sole in English. Adding –ism means the belief of something, so solipsism is the belief that the self is the only reality. Deep, huh? I think our heads sparked on that one. The main character in our read aloud is quite the thinker.
 - Heard a few past and current vocab words in our Teacher Read Aloud-<u>Smiles to Go</u> written by Jerry Spinelli
- Identified nouns of different kinds: name people/animals; things; places; ideas/feelings.
- Used our dictionaries and textbook glossaries.
- Completed our first Vocabulary Quiz (including spelling and meaning)

Math

- Completed our first "Mad Minutes" (Timed tests-addition only- 30 problems in 1 minute).
 - We will do these regularly. At this time I am not logging progress- just practice for now.
- Reviewed odd and even numbers
 - Looked at patterns of adding all odd numbers together, odd and even numbers, and all even numbers.
 - Compared and contrasted
 - Made conclusions

Health/Science/Social Studies

- Continued with TAG (Tell me something you know; Ask me a question; Give me a suggestion) in science
- Opened our social studies textbooks for the first time.
- Defined geography terms in social studies.
- Began a continent map project.
