### **Vocabulary List: Know the spelling, meaning, and part(s) of speech.**

**attack-** VERB to start a fight or battle; to assault or assail; to fall upon with force or violence and with the intent to kill or injure

**curtain-** NOUN a piece of material that covers a window or other area to give privacy or block light; something that hides or separates

**foolish-** ADJECTIVE lacking good sense, intelligence, or judgment; silly, unwise, stupid, or idiotic

**herbs-** NOUN plants used as medicine or to flavor foods

**injured-** VERB hurt; harmed; wounded; damaged  
ADJECTIVE describing something that is hurt, wounded, or damaged

**secretly-** ADVERB without the knowledge of others; privately; in a hidden or concealed manner

**strange-** ADJECTIVE odd; unusual; bizarre; unfamiliar; different

**thatch-** VERB to cover with plant material, often in regard to a roof

**tightly-** ADVERB with a strong grip; firmly or securely

**warriors-** NOUN ones, usually experienced veterans, who fight in battles or wars; soldiers or fighters
